Background

The International Conferences on Translation Studies have taken place at the School of Languages since 2006. The four previous editions gathered scholars, professors, students and professionals in the area of translation, interpretation and related disciplines to foster critical thought and dialogue on our object of study as well as on the relation and interaction with other fields of knowledge.

The V International Conference on Translation Studies organized by the Translation Studies Department (ATra, Área de Traductología) of the Research Center of the School of Languages (CIFAL, Centro de Investigaciones de la Facultad de Lenguas) invites to approach this field of knowledge from various perspectives to set up a dialogue between theory and practice, teaching and professional performance, among other aspects from where translation studies can be addressed. It intends to promote debates within the discipline itself, but also among the related fields of study that permeate and complement it, generating common ground and a forum for discussion and reflection on all the areas of translation studies.

With the V International Conference on Translation Studies, ATRA aims at:

- > strengthening the dissemination of translation studies among beginners and scholars;
- reinforcing the bonds with members from the national community and international groups;
- reflecting on the different perspectives from where we can address the translation studies;

- reflecting on and exchanging theoretical and practical aspects of the translation studies;
- thinking on, discussing about and exchanging historical developments and current trends on translation studies;
- rightharpoonup contributing to the training of professors, students and graduate students connected to undergraduate and graduate academic programs.

Abstract Guidelines and Submission

Please follow the indications below:

- Title in upper case, bold and centered.
- Indicate name and last name of the author or authors. Authors can present up to two papers in any of the above mentioned modalities. Each author must register and pay the registration fee independently.
- Institutional affiliation.
- Email address.
- Topic.
- Type of work to be presented (presentation sessions, research project panels or posters).
- Add the word 'Abstract', and then mention the topic, hypothesis, methodology, theoretical framework and, where appropriate, conclusions.
- Length: 300 400 words. Font: Times New Roman, size 12. Paragraphs: aligned, single space. Sheet: A4. Processor: Word for Windows version 2003 or later.
- The file must be named as follows: Last name and first name initial of the author followed by an underscore and the word 'Abstract' (PerezA_Abstract.docx).
- Abstracts must be sent to: atra@lenguas.unc.edu.ar

Abstracts can be sent until March 15th, 2019.
